PETITION:

For return of custody of a one and a half-year old male, black and tan, German Shepard/Husky named 'Thor'. Allegedly, on October 2, 2019 'Thor' was reported running at large when he attacked Ms. Mujaahida Latif, biting her on the arm. Corporal Brown #2878, was chased on scene by 'Thor'. 'Thor' also attacked a Mrs. Stinson, who was across the street from the original incident. This is the third time 'Thor' has been at large in the community. Ariel Estrada was found in violation of Section 3-135 'Animal at Large', Section 3-145 'Ferret, Dog, and Cat License', and Section 3-186 'Vaccination of Ferrets, Dogs, and Cats' of the Prince George's County Code and paid fines in the amount of two-hundred (\$200) dollars.

CHARGES:

Allegedly Ariel Estrada's dog, a male black and tan German Shepard/Husky named 'Thor', was running at large on October 2, 2019 when he attacked Ms. Mujaahida Latif, biting her on the arm. Corporal Brown #2878, was chased on scene by 'Thor'. 'Thor' also attacked a Mrs. Stinson, who was across the street from the original incident. This is the third time 'Thor' has been at large in the community. Your dog shows the propensity to be vicious by virtue of the alleged attack. This is in violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals; Prohibition of Nuisances', Section 3-135 'Animals at Large Prohibited', Section 3-136 'Vicious Animals', Section 3-145 'Ferret, Dog, and Cat Licenses' and Section 3-148 'License and Tags' of the Prince George's County Code.

GENERAL RULES

Cases shall be called in the order in which they appear on the docket. The Commission may consider cases out of the order presented on the written docket, at the discretion of the Chairperson, to promote efficiency and as an accommodation to the parties involved.

All attempts will be made to allot time fairly to opposing parties and witnesses. However, all persons testifying under oath shall speak only after receiving recognition and consent of the Chairperson.

Hearings are open to the public. Verbal and physical disruptions from the public are prohibited. Members of the public are required to comply with rules, directives, and orders of the Commission.
