Volunteer Programs

The Animal Management Division (AMD) provides opportunities for students to fulfill their community service requirement for graduation. Any student, 14 years of age or older, that is interested in volunteer work at the Animal Services Facility, must complete an <u>application</u> (PDF). AMD also accepts court ordered community service volunteers. This is coordinated through Parole and Probation, Department of Public Safety and Corrections and the State of Maryland.

Anyone wishing to pursue volunteer work with the AMD should either call (301) 780-7220 or visit the shelter and obtain an application. The approval process normally takes two weeks to complete. Volunteer work is available to students in half-day shifts on Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and for adults 18 or over from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. seven days a week.
