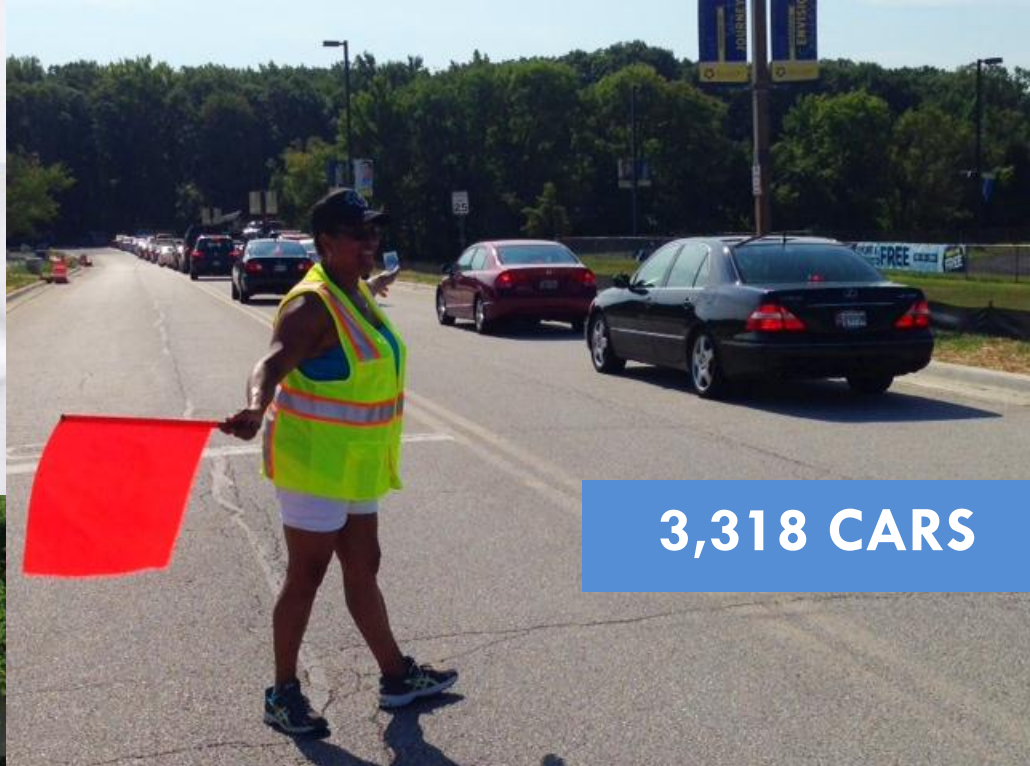

All of these animals were saved thanks to the kindness of their foster families.



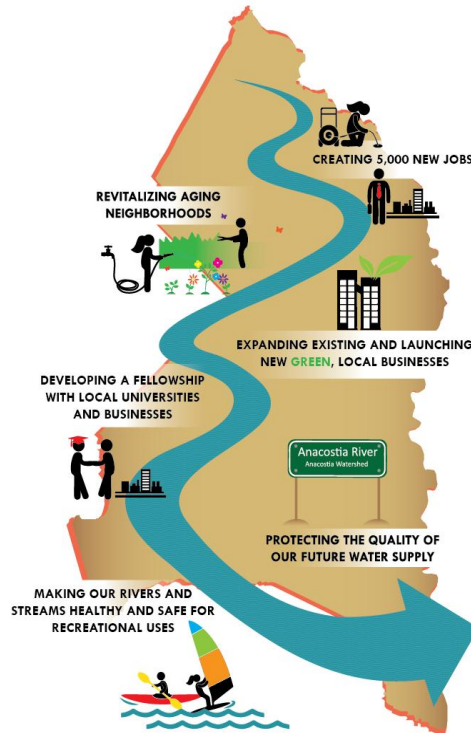
Volunteer Programs

The Animal Management Division (AMD) provides opportunities for students to fulfill their community service requirement for graduation. Any student, 14 years of age or older, that is interested in volunteer work at the Animal Services Facility, must complete an [application](#) (PDF). AMD also accepts court ordered community service volunteers. This is coordinated through Parole and Probation, Department of Public Safety and Corrections and the State of Maryland.

Anyone wishing to pursue volunteer work with the AMD should either call (301) 780-7220 or visit the shelter and obtain an application. The approval process normally takes two weeks to complete. Volunteer work is available to students in half-day shifts on Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and for adults 18 or over from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. seven days a week.

THE DRAFT IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR THE
ANACOSTIA RIVER WATERSHED TOTAL MAXIMUM
DAILY LOAD FOR TRASH

The Prince George's County Department of the Environment (DoE) will hold public meetings to provide an overview and receive comments on the County's draft local total maximum daily load (TMDL) restoration plan for trash. These meetings are in accordance with the County's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Discharge Permit Number MD0068284. Under this permit, DoE will evaluate current trash and litter control efforts and develop strategies to address the Anacostia River Watershed TMDL for trash and litter.
