



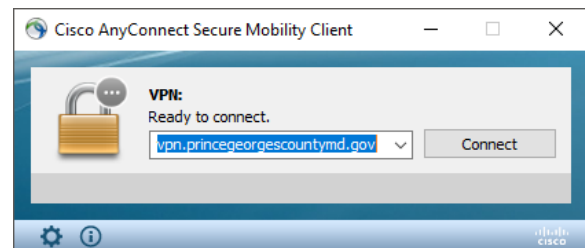
Employee Update – March 18, 2020

VPN Issues? Here's How You Can Help



The County's VPN—or *virtual private network*—securely connects your computer to the County's servers via the internet and allows you to access the County's network, files, and systems from a remote location (e.g., your home). The Office of Information Technology (OIT) has notified agency IT Coordinators that the system is at capacity and they are actively working to increase the capacity.

The VPN has a capacity limit.

If you've noticed that it's difficult to access the VPN, or if you keep getting disconnected from the VPN, the reason is because there are hundreds of employees trying to access it at the same time. OIT is actively working to increase the capacity.

You don't need to use the VPN to access every system.

Employees who are teleworking do not need to log into the VPN to access systems and applications, such as Kronos (Timekeeping), Office 365 (Microsoft products), and OneDrive (File sharing). Note: Employees may require VPN access to the network when accessing an application or any file saved on network drives (e.g., H:\ or I:\) that have not previously been copied over to OneDrive.

Log out of the VPN when you are not using it.

Until the capacity for the VPN can be increased, it is critical that all VPN users connect when they need to access an internal only system. VPN users **must disconnect** when they are no longer accessing a system that requires the VPN.
