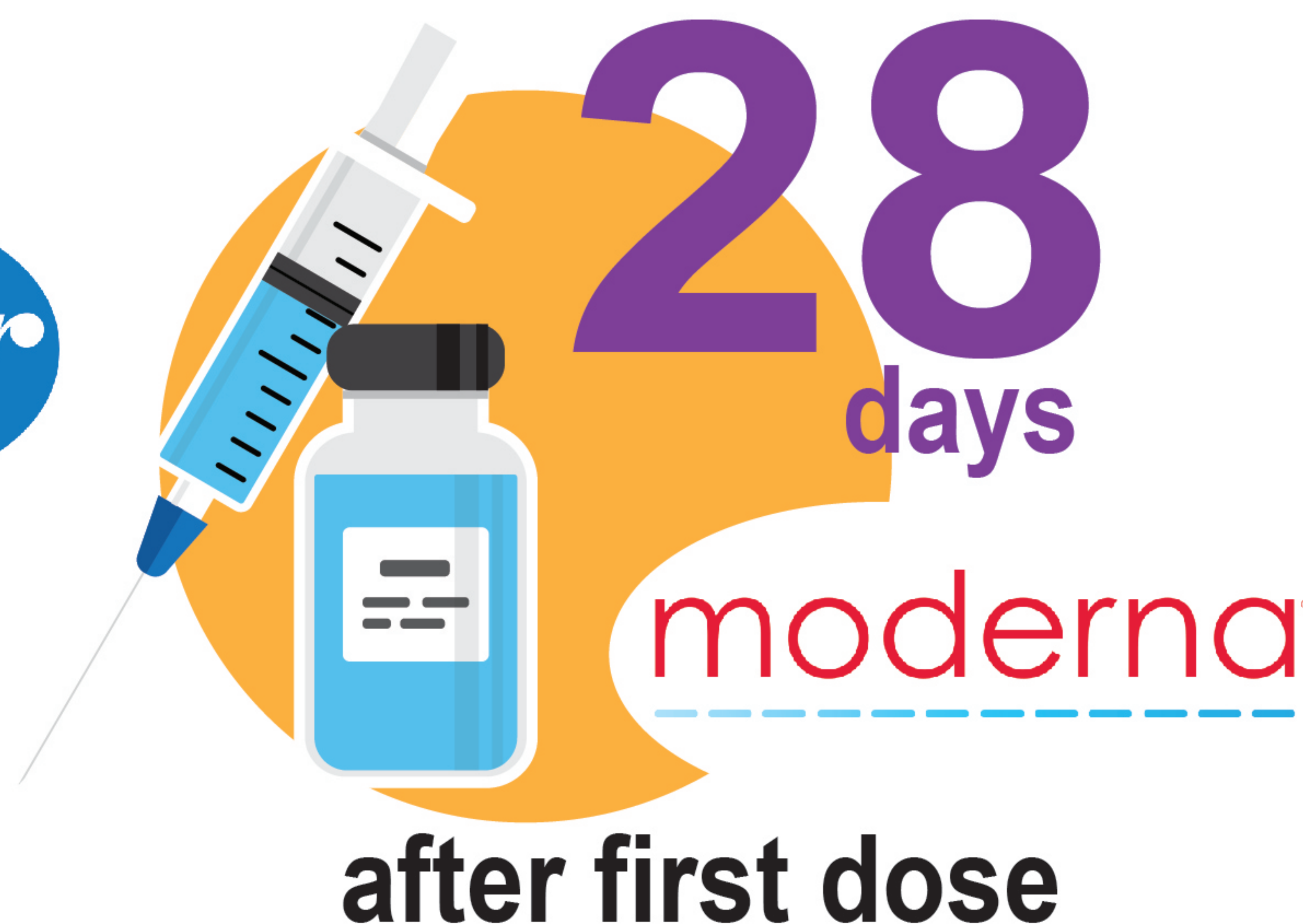
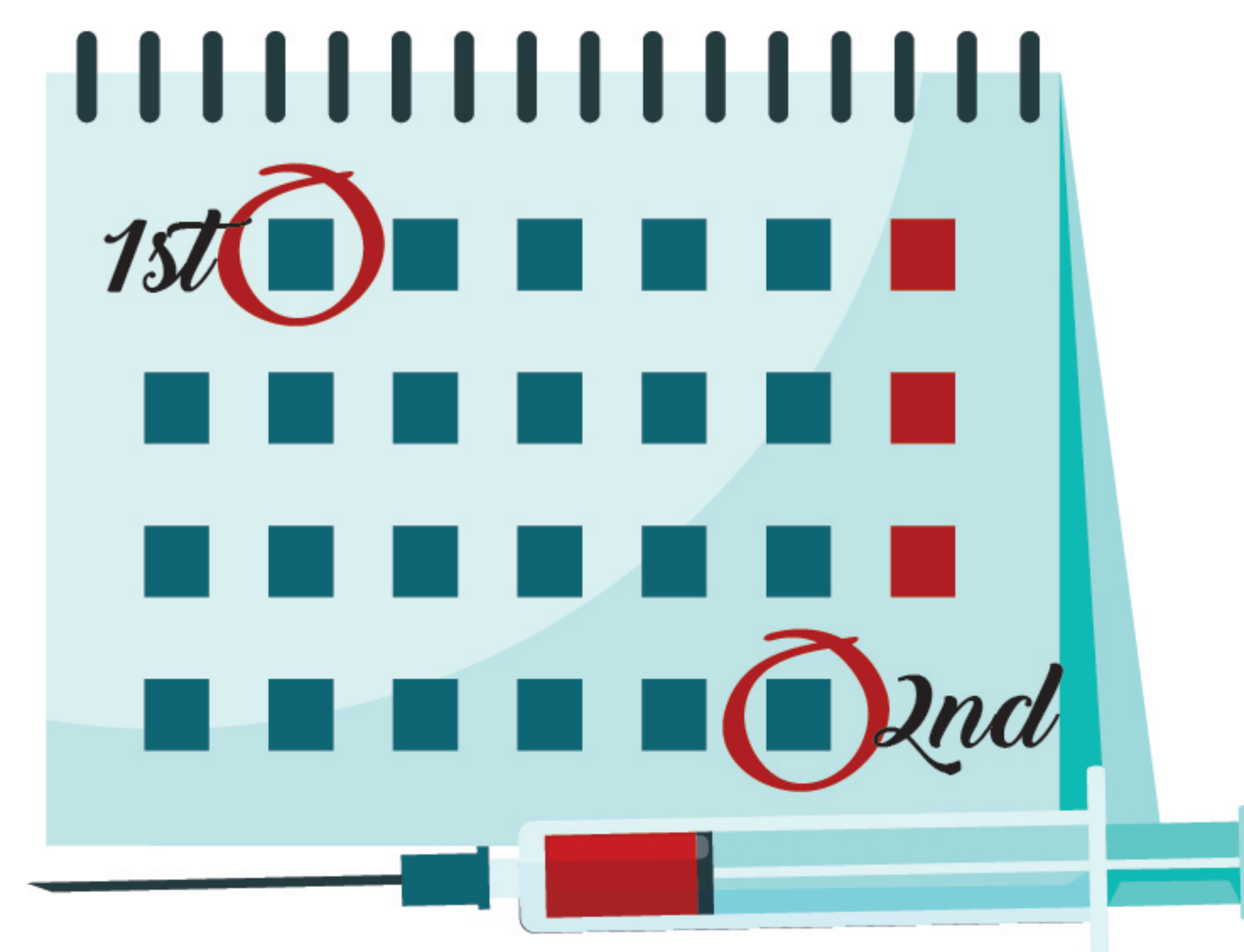
2nd Dose Appointments: What You Need to Know

Current COVID-19 vaccines require two doses given several weeks apart. You should not receive your second dose earlier than recommended. The CDC advises second doses should be given as close as possible to the recommended timeframe since the first dose was administered.



2nd Dose Appointment:

If you are unable to schedule a second dose appointment at the time of your first dose appointment, the County Health Department will follow up with you to schedule your appointment as the timeframe for your second dose approaches.

CDC Statement on 2nd Dose Timing:

The CDC further advises that if there is an unavoidable delay in adhering to the recommended timeframe, the second dose of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccines may be administered up to 42 days after the first dose.
