Prince George's County enters Phase 2B for COVID-19 vaccine distribution on Tuesday, March 30, 2021



- Individuals who live or work in Prince George's County must pre-register in order to receive a vaccine appointment with the Prince George's County Health Department. No walk-ups are being accepted.
- Beginning Tuesday, March 30, pre-registered individuals who live or work in the County that are eligible in Phase 2B will be able to receive appointments with the County Health Department.
- Eligible individuals in Phase 1 who have not yet pre-registered with the County Health Department are still encouraged to do so.
- The County will continue to prioritize individuals in Phase 1 who have not yet been vaccinated.

Phase 2B includes:

- Residents 16 and older with medical conditions that increase their risk for severe COVID-19 illness, including:
 - ~ Cancer
 - ~ Chronic kidney disease
 - ~ Chronic lung diseases, including COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), asthma moderate-to-severe, interstitial lung disease, cystic fibrosis, and pulmonary hypertension
 - ~ Dementia or other neurological conditions
 - ~ Diabetes (Type 1 or 2)
 - ~ Down Syndrome
 - ~ Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies, or hypertension
 - ~ HIV
 - ~ Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system)
 - ~ Liver disease
 - ~ Overweight/Obesity (BMI of 25 kg/m2 or higher)
 - ~ Pregnancy
 - ~ Sickle cell disease or thalassemia
 - ~ Smoking
 - ~ Solid organ or blood stem cell transplant
 - ~ Stroke or cerebrovascular disease
 - ~ Substance use disorders
- Residents 16 and older with disabilities who are receiving SSI or SSDI benefits, Maryland Medicaid EID individuals, Maryland Medicaid REM recipients, and Marylanders receiving TDAP benefits.
- Residents receiving long-term services and support through the State's Medicaid waiver and State plan services.
