 State Board of Elections (SBE) email dated January 5, 2025, from Katherine Berry, providing information on the Election Director Evaluation Program. SBE will conduct evaluations of local boards of elections administrators. Some administrators are employed by the State, and some by the local jurisdiction. Therefore, some evaluation units will not apply to all administrators. SBE anticipates conducting two evaluations per month starting in January 2025.
