#### **Elected Officials Report**

- Economic Matters Committee
  - Delegate Veronica Turner, 26<sup>th</sup> District
    - Just passed the budget today (3-20-24)
    - Introduced with Senator Muse, 2 bond initiatives bills
      - The Rock Christian Church Ministries \$50,000
        - Will increase opportunity for local underserved communities
          - Mostly African and Hispanic American immigrants and refuge populations
          - Increase and install updated technology

- Safeguard indoor space with a variety of activities for all age groups
- Camp Springs Elks Lodge over \$200, 000
  - Planning for some improvements and capital equipment; lodge roofing construction to support community events and charitable programs and outdoor lighting to bring to code
- 2 House Bills
  - HB 360 Prince George's County Retail Service Gasoline Station Bureau
    Service Extended as a community Safety Bill 24/7 full-service pump for community members which was withdrawn
    - Undue fiscal burden on owner of the gas station more employees
    - o Risk of harm and robberies
    - Will bring the bill back next year as seniors need protection
  - HB 805 Extends the fairness and distribution of locations of cannabis dispensaries
    - Undue the burden of where dispensaries are allowed to locate stores
    - Prevent obstacles being created to stop the transport of cannabis through certain legislative zones to the dispensary
    - Established a distance the dispensaries are allowed within sensitive locations such as churches, schools, and daycares
      - Amendment 2, 000 feet from sensitive locations
    - Primarily regarding zoning and locations for cannabis dispensaries
    - Placing bills in each County
    - Going over to the Senate side; will crossover Monday
- Health and Government Operations Committee Insurance and Pharmaceuticals Subcommittee and Health Occupation and Long-Term Care Subcommittee
  - Delegate Jamila Woods
    - Primary sponsor of 4 bills in Health and Government Operations
      - First bill Medical assistance program, remote ultrasound procedures, remote fetal, and non-stress tests
        - Ultrasound and remote fetal non-stress tests are an opportunity for pregnant mothers who are at risk to be able to get services at home
        - Bill passed unanimously in the House and the Senate
      - The next bill Advanced practice registered nurses certification requirement and exceptions
        - Allows for students who are in school to practice their trade under the supervision of a registered nurse
        - Bill passed unanimously
      - The next bill Maryland Department of Health Public Education Campaign on prostate, lung, and breast cancer prevention

- Cancer has been a huge challenge for people in Maryland and people of color and marginalized populations
- This bill will get a campaign out next year to help people to understand what are the things that you can do, what are the tests that you can take, what are things that you can do to make sure your prostate, lung, and breast are in the best of health
- Bill passed unanimously
- Forth bill Health insurance appeals and grievances process
  - Demands that insurance companies are more transparent about why they are denying claims, why they are denying preauthorization for services
  - o Bill passed unanimously in the House and the Senate
- Another bill Welfare checks Gabriel's Law
  - Requires law enforcement agencies to conduct wellness checks without unreasonable delay
  - Bill passed unanimously in the House and currently in the Senate
- Also served as the co-sponsor of 79 additional bills in the House and Government Operations Committee, 4 bills in the Judiciary Committee, 3 Bills Environment and Transportation Committee, 2 bills in Economic Matters, and one bill in appropriations
  - If anyone wants to know more, Delegate Woods can share
- Submitted a bond request in District 26, Temple Hills
  - Lauren Jones, black business owner "I Grow Therapeutic Garden"
  - Business: Propel Production Center, 501c3 Nonprofit Organization specializing in social-emotional learning, socioeconomic development and social justice through art, nature, and play
  - Therapeutic garden is to help people to learn about the importance of gardening – a very therapeutic process that helps people to work through the different behavioral health or mental health challenges
- Host a 26 District Dialogue Series with the delegates and Senator Muse
  - Dates provided in the chat to participate April 27<sup>th</sup> at 2pm, Accokeek Library – flyer shared with LDC via email
  - This is the time that we, as a delegation, talk about the things that are most important to you
- Passing of Mirinda Della Jackson
  - Assest to Prince George's County
  - Moment of silence

### Council Member Edward Burroughs Office

- Preston Ross, Chief of Staff
  - Senior Tax Credits
    - More than 130 seniors that came to committee to push bill
  - Pushing year-round job and apprenticeship for high school and middle school aged students

- Budget FY2025 initiatives that want to support legislatively and through budget
- LIG money given to recipients within District and partners received approximately 2-3 weeks ago
  - Starting to see the impact within community
- Scholarship program for Prince George's County residents over \$90,000 100,000
  - Academically, Student Leadership, Enginuity
- Council Member Edward Burroughs
  - o Thanks to the LDC Chairs, Elected Officials, Strategic Partnerships, and the Team
  - Will share the flyer for available scholarships
  - Working on year-round jobs program that include apprenticeships and internships for youth
    - Various locations
    - Quality partners
  - Senior Tax Credit bill
    - Passed unanimously last week due to senior presence
  - Financial literacy and resources
    - Partnered with Prince George's County Federal Credit Union
    - Resident \$44/month, will match 500 slots
      - Increase credit score (30-70 points average)
    - Working with Delegate Woods on Mental Health
      - 988 Mental Health Campaign in all High Schools mental health resources
        - o Competition \$7,500
      - LDC invited to participate
      - Mental Health First Aid
      - May 30-31, 2024 with Taraji P. Henson at the Gaylord
        - Student showcase from competition
- Will share information with the Local Development Council for dissemination
- Bershan Shaw Mental Health Application
  - Will email information to connect and collaborate
