Commissioner Camacho: I'm going to go over a few house rules. We understand that we're in a network situation with connectivity issues, we ask that you mute your computers or cell phones until you're called.  Jason Michael Hunter, President/Secretary/Treasurer, for a Class B, Beer, Wine and Liquor for the use of Lambert Seafood Company, Inc., t/a Lambert's, 10825 Lanham Severn Road, Glenn Dale, 20769 transfer from Lambert Seafood Inc., t/a Lambert's, 10825 Lanham Severn Road, Glenn Dale, 20769, Stephen M. Lambert, President, Daniel P. Hunter, Secretary/Treasurer.

The applicant joined Lambert's in 2004 and became the manager in 2010. Mr. Hunter is now buying the previous owner out and looks forward to becoming the sole licensee.

Ms. Carter asked the standard questions typically used to qualify the transfer of the license. Including what are the six acceptable forms of I.D., and the legal age to purchase and sell alcohol. The applicant was able to answer each question. Mr. Hunter is Alcohol Awareness certified.

Commissioner Norman makes a motion to approve the transfer of the Class B license for t/a Lambert's, seconded by **Commissioner Sparkman**.

An amendment to the application to reflect the licensed portion of the building is 6,014 square feet and includes the rooftop and patio.

Ms. Carter asked the standard questions typically used to qualify this type of the license. Including what are the six acceptable forms of I.D., and the legal age to purchase and sell alcohol.

Commissioner Norman makes a motion to approve the Class B, BLX, license for t/a Skyvibe Restaurant and Lounge, seconded by **Commissioner Sparkman**. After Board vote, the motion carries.

Ms. Mbeng was previously a license holder with 5 Sisters Restaurant from 2012 to 2022. 5 Sisters Restaurant was found in violation for purchasing from other than a wholesaler during Ms. Mbeng's tenure as a license holder. This establishment has received three violations, but Ms. Mbeng was present for one.

Commissioner Camacho asked both applicants the standard questions typically used to qualify this type of the license. Including what are the six acceptable forms of I.D., and the legal age to purchase and sell alcohol. The applicants were able to answer each question.

Commissioner Norman makes a motion to approve the Class B license for t/a Pleroma Cuisine, seconded by **Commissioner Sparkman**.

After Board vote, the motion carries.

 Alexander Asong, Authorized Person, for a Class B, Beer and Wine for the use of Zactech Solutions, LLC, t/a King Pollo, 8321 Annapolis Road, New Carrollton, 20784. Represented by Rowena N. Nelson, Esquire.

Deputy Chief Mendoza gave a map presentation.

The applicant has never previously held a license.

King Pollo was already operating as a Latino, West African, and American restaurant when Mr. Asong purchased the business.

A carding policy will be in place, and no one under the age of twenty-one will serve alcohol.

Ms. Nelson asked the standard questions typically used to qualify the transfer of the license. Including what are the six acceptable forms of I.D., and the legal age to purchase and sell alcohol. The applicant was able to answer each question.

Commissioner Norman makes a motion to approve the Class B license for t/a King Pollo, seconded by **Commissioner Sparkman**.

After Board vote, the motion carries.
