COVID-19 VACCINE

Prince George's County enters Phase 1C for COVID-19 vaccine distribution on Monday, March 15, 2021



- Individuals who live or work in Prince George's County must pre-register in order to receive a vaccine appointment with the Prince George's County Health Department. No walk-ups are being accepted.
- Beginning Monday, March 15, pre-registered individuals who live or work in the County that are eligible in Phase 1C will begin to receive appointments with the County Health Department.
- Eligible individuals in Phases 1A and 1B who have not yet pre-registered with the County Health Department are still encouraged to do so.

Phase 1C includes:

- **Adults 65-74 years of age**
- **Public safety not covered in Phase 1A**
- **Clergy/religious leadership**
- **Health and human services not covered in Phase 1A**
 - ~ Public health workers
 - ~ Lab services
 - ~ Vaccine manufacturing
 - ~ Departments of Family Services, Social Services, Human Services
 - ~ Veterinarians
- **Essential workers at high risk of exposure**
 - ~ Food and agriculture workers
 - ~ Grocery store workers
 - ~ Postal service workers
 - ~ Public transit workers
- **Individuals receiving treatment in a hospital (including hospital outpatient centers) AND diagnosed with at least one of the following conditions:**
 - ~ Cancer patients in active treatment
 - ~ Solid organ transplant recipients
 - ~ Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
 - ~ Diabetic patients (type 1 and 2)
 - ~ End-stage renal disease patients requiring renal dialysis
 - ~ Sickle cell disease patients
